Provides: Immediate focused and intensive support to families. Support families who are experiencing a behavioral or mental health crisis, provide referrals for assessment and direct service, along with family support so as to prevent the situation from escalating.

The *FAVOR Juvenile Justice Family Liaison Pilot Initiative* will provide families with knowledge, information and direct support during a child or other family members' contact with the Juvenile Justice system. The direct support provided to families, will assist them in making good choices and informed decisions about their children's future while assisting the court and Juvenile Justice professionals in understanding as much as possible, the child's strengths, needs and family history.

The Juvenile Justice Liaison will assist the DCF Bureau of Juvenile Justice and the Court Support Services Division (CSSD) in achieving the right balance between public safety and rehabilitation for youth in care. Collaboration with the existing education liaisons, local systems of care and private providers offer additional opportunities for both family and community collaboration.

Childcare is provided without charge and there is also a children's activity group. The children's activities are geared to help the children feel better about themselves and develop peer relationships that help to normalize their situation. The childcare can also serve as a respite for grandparents. Refreshments are provided for all.
